About the Property

The **Ice Age Junction Trail** is a paved, multi-use path that runs through the Ice Age Trail Junction Natural Resources Area and Badger Prairie County Park and connects to the Military Ridge State Trail. It is open to hiking, biking, and other non-motorized uses. This trail is part of a larger concept to create a major north-south bike path extending from Verona to Middleton.

The **Ice Age Trail Junction Natural Resources Area** is a 554-acre area that creates a link in the 1,000-mile long Ice Age National Scenic Trail and connections to statewide recreational trail networks. It is made possible by partnerships between Dane County, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the National Park Service, the City of Verona, the Town of Verona, and the Ice Age Trail Alliance.

Rules and Information

HOURS Open daily from 5:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

BIKING* A State Trail Pass is required for all people age 16 or older biking or in-line skating on the Military Ridge State Trail, but not on the Ice Age Junction Trail. Biking is not allowed on unpaved trails, except on the designated mountain bike trails at Badger Prairie County Park (Mountain Bike Permit required).

DOGS* All dogs **MUST** be leashed and their waste removed. All dog owners must have a valid dog permit to bring their dog onto the property. An off-leash dog park is located at nearby Badger Prairie County Park.

TRASH All trash must be deposited in the proper containers.
