## JUNIOR NATURALIST



## SALMO POND UPDATE

Salmo Pond is in the middle of a parking lot reconstruction project. In addition to a new parking lot, the project includes adding storm water biofiltration basins, replacing the existing vault toilet, pathway improvements to the fishing piers and adding a new picnic table as part of the memorial Dan Wisniewski Accessible Fishing Area.

Park operation staff have removed the old vault toilet and installed the new one. Dane County Parks is very lucky to have such a talented and knowledgeable crew!



## INDIAN LAKE PROPERTY PLAN

Dane County Parks will begin working on a property plan that will propose future management, recreation use and park facility development for Indian Lake County Park and the adjacent Halfway Prairie Wildlife Area.

Two public information meetings will be held to begin the planning process to gather public input:

- May 16 at 7:00 p.m. Lussier Family Heritage Center and VIRTUAL
- June 6 at 5:30 p.m. Town of Berry Town Hall Shelter


## HELP US NAME OUR RESCUE TURTLE

# WELCOME RANGER CADETS


