

TOKEN CREEK ROAD RECONSTRUCTION

Dane County Parks is reconstructing a portion of the park road at Token Creek County Park starting May 25.

Road closures at the main park entrance will require park users to use alternative routes to access the park via the entrance at **4036 Anderson Road**. Campers can continue to use Williamsburg entrance.



RESTROOM UPGRADES

Dane County Parks is part of the Dane County Land & Water Resources Department. The department created an Equity and Inclusion plan in 2018 and we have been working on implementing it. We wanted to share a few ways we are working to make our park restrooms more inclusive:

- We have upgraded all of the portable toilets in our park system to units that are **ADA accessible**.
- The signage on all of our single stall restrooms is currently being replaced with **gender-inclusive signage**.
- We have a new Open Restrooms webpage on our website to help the public figure out which parks have open restrooms that will work for them.




JUNIOR NATURALIST



CHAINSAW SAFETY TRAININGS

Dane County Parks is offering Level 1 and Level 2 **SAWW Chainsaw Safety Trainings.** These courses are taught by certified SAWW (Safety and Woods Working) trainer Luke Saunders of Adaptive Restoration. Level 1 and Level 2 are part of the four-level SAWW series designed to increase safety and efficiency of chainsaw use.


