Restroom facilities comply with ADA guidelines and all portable toilets are wheelchair accessible. Open restrooms are listed on our website.



Fees & Permits

Visiting and hiking in the Dane County Park
System is free. Some activities require a daily or
annual permit that can purchased online or at
electronic pay stations at some properties.

Cross-country Skiing

Miles of designated ski trails are groomed to provide cross-country skiers spectacular views. A Cross-county Ski Trail Permit is required. Groomed trails are available at:

- CamRock County Park
- Indian Lake County Park
- Lewis Nine Springs E-Way
- McCarthy Youth & Conservation Park
- Token Creek County Park
- W.G. Lunney Lake Farm County Park

Trails are groomed for both classic and skate skiing. Cross-country skiing is allowed on undesignated trails, however these are not groomed and conditions may not be ideal.



Sledding

There are four park properties that have designated sledding hills:

- CamRock County Park: Moderate hill with a gradual slope and wonderful view.
- Indian Lake County Park: Fairly gentle and short.
- Lake View Hill County Park: Nice gentle downhill but a long walk back up.
- McCarthy Youth & Conservation County Park: Slope is quite steep and might be better suited for older kids.

Ice Fishing - Lake Access Sites

Explore beautiful ice fishing spots on the Yahara chain of lakes and other locations in our park system. A Lake Access Permit is required to park at improved lake access sites, as well as Lussier County Park, Mendota County Park and, Upper Mud Lake. Dane County Parks does not monitor ice conditions or thickness.

Snowmobiling

Snowmobile trails pass through some park properties. Snowmobilers must remain on marked trails at all times and display a valid snowmobile trail pass sold by Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

Dogs

Dogs are welcome at our eight off-leash dog parks and on-leash throughout the Dane County Park System. Dogs must have a valid Dane County Dog Permit.

Snowshoeing & Hiking

Snowshoeing and winter hiking is allowed on or off-trail at all park properties. The following locations have designated snowshoe trails that are marked to help with navigation:

- Indian Lake County Park
- McCarthy Youth & Conservation Park
- Token Creek County Park
- W.G. Lunney Lake Farm County Park / Capital Springs State Park.

Note that snowshoeing, hiking, and dogs are NOT allowed on designated cross-country ski trails when snow is present, even if they have not been groomed.

Winter Biking & Mt. Biking


The Anderson Farm Park Trail, Capital City State Trail (State Trail Pass required), and Lower Yahara River Trail offer plowed hardsurfaces for biking or pedestrian use.


Single-track mountain bike trails at available at three locations during the winter. A Mountain Bike Permit is required. Trails are available at:

- Badger Prairie County Park
- CamRock County Park
- Seminole Mountain Bike Trails

Winter Recreation Map

All properties in the Dane County Park System are available for winter recreation, however some parking areas may have limited or no access during certain snow conditions. The park properties labeled on the map below have **plowed winter parking** maintained by park staff or other entities. Some parking areas at the park property may not be plowed.


