


Survey Geographic Response Rates













Parks Participation Data













Summer Recreation Participation Levels






Summer Recreation What do people want to see more of?

- More bike trails connecting our parks






Winter Recreation Participation Levels

Winter disc golf and trail running






Winter Recreation What do people want to see more of?

- More winter hiking trails






Barriers to Using Parks

We also heard...

- Lack of facilities , restrooms, shelters
- Don't want to go places where hunting is allowed






Age Groups Adequately Served?






Do People Feel Safe?


We also heard...

- Don't feel safe by myself at night








Change One Thing...Dogs






Change One Thing...Bike Trails









"I love that there are parks close to every community in Dane County."


"They are a diverse group of public lands that showcase the diversity of the Dane County countryside."

Big Takeaways.... What do people want to see more of?

- Land acquisition & natural resource management
- Hiking trails, bike/ped trails, mountain bike trails, disc golf, and dog parks
- Connectivity of land, trails, and facilities
- Winter disc golf and winter access for hiking/trail running
- Places to hike with dogs off-leash
- Restrooms and shelters
- Facilities for elderly or those using wheelchairs (i.e. benches, no trip hazards, easy/paved trails, etc.)
- Activities to attract youth and connect them to nature
- Walk-in or rustic campsites
- Better park maps, trail mileage, information, etc. at parks



How is the Survey Information Used in the POSP?

- One of multiple planning considerations to determine park system needs
- Compared against other related surveys; City of Madison Parks POSP, State SCORP to identify planning themes
- Compared against other public input and planning information gathered during the planning process
